umane Society of the United States (HSUS), the nation's largest animal protection agency, urges potential pet owners to consider the benefits of adoption—to themselves and society at large.

"Shelter pets are fabulous pets. There is nothing wrong with them," explains Betsy McFarland, senior director of the Companion Animals section of The HSUS. "People assume they are 'damaged goods' or that they've been abused, but animals lose their homes for lots of reasons. For example, some are relinquished because their families have lost their homes due to foreclosure, or because their owners have passed away. Shelters generally do a great job of assessing the animals, so if there are any issues they'll educate you."

Another misconception about shelters is that their variety is limited and that they only carry mutts.

"Shelters have a wide range of pets, even birds and guinea pigs, and there are rescue groups for every species and breed you are interested in," says McFarland. "In fact, one in four dogs entering shelters is pure-bred!"

Besides paying much less than you would at a store, you'll also save money because shelters provide the first round of vaccination and sterilization before adoption.

Shelters are forced to euthanize



more than three million healthy dogs and cats every year, so before you shell out the big bucks to a breeder or pet store, stop by your local shelter and save some money—and a life.

Keeping your Pet Flea-Free

mericans will spend an estimated \$45 billion on their pets this year, buying everything from food, veterinary care and grooming/boarding services to overthe-counter pest control remedies.

"You'd be hard-pressed to find a pet owner who hasn't had a problem with fleas, ticks or mosquitoes," says Tradewinds' Companion Animal Business Unit Manager Brian Reardon. "I always stress the importance of an integrated flea control program. There's no single magic bullet. You need to be proactive and use a spot-on or squeeze-on topical product along with premise sprays so you target the indoor and outdoor areas as well as

the animal.

Flea bites can lead to hair loss and skin problems in sensitive pets. Some animals are allergic to flea saliva, thus a visit from a single pest spawns severe discomfort. Flea infestations can also lead to tapeworm problems. When grooming themselves, pets may ingest a flea larva that has swal-

lowed a tapeworm egg, which is then released and free to develop in the host's intestine.

Not all remedies are created equal. TriForce, a Tradewinds, Inc. product, kills and repels ticks, mosquitoes and fleas, as well as their eggs and larvae, unlike some other treatments that only target full-grown fleas.

The EPA regulates products like TriForce, but owners should still keep certain safety tips in mind. Reardon emphasizestheimportanceofreading product labels: "Some active compounds are safe for both felines and canines, but some dog flea products are dangerous to cats, so be sure to read the package carefully."



How Safe is Your Pet Food?

ownload a list of pet food products that have been recalled since March 2007 from the FDA's website and you'll find yourself perusing a spreadsheet cataloging hundreds of products from 20 different manufacturers. An array of companies have taken food from dog chow to ferret treats to fish flakes—off the shelves.

Pet food safety usually falls under the FDA's jurisdiction. As a result of recent recalls, including the Peanut Corporation of America's voluntary recall of peanut butter at risk for Salmonella contamination last January, consumers and congressmen alike are clamoring for a more effective food regulatory system, for humans and animals alike.

a 50-year-old family-run company, opts to use USDA rather than FDA inspected ingredients in its pet food. Their employees abide by the same rigorous safety procedures whether producing food for animal or human consumption.

"The USDA monitors meat, poultry and processed egg products. You might see an FDA inspector once every few years. It's an under-funded agency with a huge area to cover.We see our USDA inspector daily," explains Michael Morasch, president of NWN. "In the future, I think we will see additional products falling under USDA's jurisdiction."

FDA inspectors currently lack the ability to mandate a recall of tainted food. The Food and Drug Administration

> Globalization Act, introduced in

Northwest Naturals (NWN), Congress earlier this year, would increase the FDA's authority. Its goal is to improve the safety of food, drugs and cosmetics in the global market, and it includes proposals to generate more revenue to support the FDA's efforts, increase inspections and improve traceability.

> Steven Morasch, co-founder of NWN, supports more effective government inspection. "There's been a lot of talk about these changes in the field. Even our own USDA inspectors have heard that they might be taking on new responsibility. We may see the creation of a 'new' FDA or part of it functions incorporated into the USDA. The authority of the USDA is much greater in terms of its ability to make immediate calls for recalls and plant closures in the event of serious concerns."

The Benefits of a Raw Diet

ust as people aim to eat the foods that will make them look and feel their best, pet owners must consider their animals' diets to ensure they live the longest and healthiest lives possible.

Some research suggests that a raw diet consisting of all-natural, uncooked meats and vegetables is preferable for cats and dogs, as it emulates what they would eat in nature. Because canines and felines did not eat cooked food in the wild, their digestive systems do not process them as efficiently as raw ingredients.

Dr. Francis Pottenger, Jr. concluded from his research in the 1930s and '40s that cats kept on a raw diet were healthier than those fed processed food. Each subsequent generation of cats on a cooked

food diet experienced increasingly severe health problems at earlier ages, according to his observations.

Raw diet advocates emphasize the importance of living enzymes—proteins that assist the digestive system and help the body function, but are almost entirely killed when food is cooked. When the pancreas overworks to produce enzymes on its own, health problems may arise.

Northwest Naturals (NWN) manufactures the original "raw nugget diet," pet food made from a blend of human-grade vegetables, fruits, and meats that is kept frozen to preserve its ingredients. Steve Morasch, co-founder of NWN, explains the diet's health benefits: "A raw natural diet will give your pet a cleaner, shinier coat. Skin irritation problems clear up

and teeth become healthier. Weight control issues are easier to manage because pets naturally eat less food, since they feel full faster due to the bioavailable nature of the nutrients in a raw natural diet."

A raw diet should include a little organ meat and raw bone, a natural source of calcium. NWN uses fresh ground bone, maintaining its natural ligament tissues, as opposed to bone meal from rendering.

NWN recommends washing vour hands before and after touching any food product. Also, be sure to research the appropriate feeding amount for your pet, as the recommended quantity varies with size, age and activity level.






Once you've determined your hotel is pro-pet, you can consider transportation. When traveling by car, do not let your pet ride with its head out the window, as dust and dirt could cause infection. Carriers should be kept in the back seat, in case the air bags should deploy. Before departing, make sure your pet is wearing identification, and check with your veterinarian to ensure vaccinations are up

Many pet owners consider air travel the most stressful of transportation options, but this may change on July 14, when Pet Airways, the first pet-only airline, takes flight. Pets will fly in carriers in the main cabin of a 19-person passenger plane reconfigured with special safety straps. "It's about safety, comfort and care. Once the pet parent drops off the pet, it is always cared for and monitored and never left alone," says Alysa Binder, co-founder.

For convenience, travelers can drop off their furry friends at the "Pet Lounge" up to 72 hours before the trip. An attendant monitors the "pawsengers" throughout the flights, which are currently limited to select U.S. cities, although Binder says they plan to expand their destination choices down the line. If you have to travel without your pet, be sure to weigh your lodging options carefully. "Cats tend to prefer their own home, so I recommend asking a good friend or neighbor, but if you have to use a boarding facility, make sure it's a reputable place," advises Weiske.
